

ENGLISH	<p>Using Text Structures Purposefully Students engage with a variety of literary texts including films, digital texts and novels for enjoyment. These texts may include reports, reviews, procedures, biographies, and autobiographies. Students explore content about a wide range of topics of interest or topics being studied in other curriculum areas. They identify text structures and features including headings, timelines and images and how these inform the reader and improve access to the information in texts. Students create a report to present to an audience.</p>
MATHS	<p>Number and place value - square and triangular numbers. Fractions and decimals - multiplying whole numbers and decimals by 10, 100 and 1 000; multiply decimals by one-digit whole numbers. Patterns and algebra - continue and create sequences involving whole numbers and decimals, describe the rule used to create these sequences and explore the use of order of operations to perform calculations. Using units of measurement - volume and capacity. Shape - create nets and construct models of simple prisms and pyramids. Geometric reasoning - angles on a straight line, angles at a point and vertically opposite angles.</p>
SCIENCE	<p>Energy and electricity Students investigate electrical circuits as a means of transferring and transforming electricity. Students will explore how energy from a variety of sources can be used to generate electricity and their sustainability.</p>
HASS	<p>Australians as global citizens In this unit students consider the rights and responsibilities of Australian citizenship. The status and rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, women and children over time will be investigated, along with the experiences of migrants since Federation.</p>
TECHNOLOGY	<p>Hands off! In this unit, students will investigate how electrical energy can control movement, sound or light in a designed product or system. They will design a solution to an environment's security need and make a prototype electrical device that is part of the solution.</p>
HPE	<p>Students will participate in circuits that will assist with skills required for athletics events. Students will learn and practise techniques required for the athletics carnival.</p>
THE ARTS	<p>Going to the movies In this unit, students make and respond to music exploring pieces of music that tell a story, and music that appears in film.</p>
LOTE	<p>Term Two's unit focuses on important people - family and friends. Students will translate and write sentences about their family in Japanese.</p>
HOMework	<p>Reading, Spelling and Maths revision will be the focus for homework this term. Some weeks there will be a special focus. Activities will need to be handed in on given dates.</p>
